Governance Structure Project Team Update

The Appraisal Institute Board of Directors created a project team in 2015 to make recommendations to the Board for possibly enhancing the overall Al governance structure and to find the optimum mix of member services and the efficient delivery of those services. The Governance Structure Project Team (GSPT) was directed to focus on determining the best ways to provide member value, considering current market realities.

The GSPT presented its recommendations to the Board in June 2017. They have prepared updated recommendations and are seeking input from Al professionals on those efforts.



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
